## Family reunion with a German citizen

## **General Information**

If the applicant is married or will get married to a German citizen, or if the applicant is a parent of a German (unborn) child and wishes to reside permanently in Germany (or stay longer than 3 months) in order to live with the family, it is required to obtain a residence permit in the form of a visa.

- In case of a family reunion with a German spouse or fiancé the applicant needs to prove basic German language skills when applying for the visa.
- Processing the visa application takes up to 12 weeks upon submission of complete documents.
   The residence permit can be issued only upon approval by the competent authorities in Germany.
   The applicant will receive a prompt notification upon completion of the processing. We ask that no status request is made if the required processing period has not yet passed.
- After the application has been approved, the German Embassy will only issue an entry permit in a
  form of a visa. A final residence permit for the whole duration of the stay will be granted in
  Germany by the Aliens Authority. The Foreigners Authority requires all residence permit holders
  to register upon their first arrival.
- It is recommended that no flight ticket is purchased until a visa has been granted!
- Further documentation may be requested in each individual case.
- Foreign documents issued in other language than English or German have to be submitted an official translation.
- Please note that foreign certificates must recognized legally for Germany. Therefore, Bahraini certificates need a so-called "Apostille". Please see our website for further information.
- Each applicant must submit one set of copies with all the following documents. (Copies will not be made by the Embassy.)

## **Visa Application Checklist** Unless otherwise specified, the documents must be submitted in a single copy (originals with one copy). Originals will be returned after the application has been processed at the latest. ☐ One (1) fully completed and signed <u>application form</u> including declarations pursuant to Section 54 Residence Act. ☐ Declarations according to § 54 (2) no. 8 in conjunction with § 53 of the German Residence Act, duly signed. ☐ Two (2) current biometric passport photos. Digitally processed photos cannot be accepted. ☐ Original passport (or travel document) valid for at least 3 months longer than the intended stay. It must contain at least two blank pages and must have been issued within the last 10 years. ☐ Provide a copy of the passport data page and if applicable previous visas withing the last three (3) years. ☐ Bahrain CPR (residence permit) and one (1) copy For Family Reunion to the German Spouse ☐ Marriage certificate or registration of marriage appointment in Germany ☐ Proof of identity of the spouse (passport, ID-card). ☐ Registration certificate (Meldebescheinigung) of the spouse residing in Germany (not older than six months). If you do not yet have a place of residence in Germany, you can prove your residential address, e.g. by presenting a rental agreement or proof of ownership. If you would initially like to move into temporary accommodation, please submit an informal letter from the accommodation provider (e.g. family members or friends) or a hotel booking.
